Previous knowledge

Teacher checks their previous knowledge by asking about drawing pictures.

Expected product

- Children draws a picture of a sun rising from behind the hills.
- Children writes a character sketch of their own siblings (If not, their friends)

Learning process

Introductory activity

Teacher greets the children and shows them different pictures which consists of various forms of art through E content slides, and asks them to identify them. And then speaks about various art forms and asks the children to draw a picture of a rising sun behind a mountain.

Presentation of the topic

Teacher shows a painted picture of sun rising from behind a hill and a field beaneath the hill. Then displays the name of the chapter 'The light on the hills "

Model reading

Teacher reads the first portion of the chapter with proper intonation and stress.

Discourse

Teacher asks the children to write a small character sketch about their siblings and for those who have no siblings they are asked to write about their best friends.

Objectives :- To teach the children how to analyse a persons character and write a character sketch.
